# TRICKY WORDS

Tricky Words are irregular words that cannot be blended or segmented.


- I, the, he, she, me, we ,be, was, to, do, are all
- You, your, come, some, said, here, there, they, go, no, so, my
- One, by, only, old, like, have, live, give, little, down, what, when
- Why, where, who, which, any, many, more, before, other, were, because, want
- Saw, put, could, should, right, two, four, goes, does, made, their
- Once, upon, always, also, of, eight, love, cover, after, every, mother, father





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# MAIN TEACHING TECHNIQUES







### **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

#### **1. Cut the Word Up (for Individual Word Practice)**

Step 1: Print out a tricky word in large font size with spaces between each letter

• Example: If the tricky word is "where," print it as:

#### WHERE

Step 2: Cut the page so that each letter is on a separate strip of paper

Step 3: Muddle up the letters

Step 4: Ask a child to rearrange the letters into the correct order to spell the word

Step 5: After three successful efforts, the word should become fixed in the child's memory

Step 6: Dictate the words afterward to check spelling accuracy.



# OTHER ACTIVITIES

#### 2. Tricky Word Letters (for Multiple Word Practice)

Step 1: Print out a few tricky words introduced during lessons (e.g., said, what, come) Step 2: Cut up each word into individual letters

• Example for "said":

#### SAID

Step 3: Muddle up all the letters from different words together and place them in front of the children

Step 4: Call out one of the tricky words, like "said."

Step 5: The children choose the appropriate letters and lay them in the correct order to form the word.



### **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

#### **3. List of Words (Say as it Sounds Technique)**

Step 1: Write each tricky word on a card using the Say as it sounds technique Step 2: Hold the card up, ensuring the children cannot see the written word Step 3: Call out the word and have the children chant it using the "Say as it sounds" method

• For example, the word said might be pronounced: "s-ay-d" (instead of how it's actually spelled) Step 4: After chanting, turn the card around and ask the children to read the word as it's spelled Step 5: Repeat with other words.

This method mixes kinesthetic learning (handling letters), auditory learning (chanting), and visual learning (seeing the words), which makes it a very effective way to reinforce tricky words!
